Office Cosmetic Procedures -- NOT COVERED BY OHIP:

Excision of Seborrhoeic Keratosis:

With Liquid Nitrogen and NOT local anesthesia:

- ▶ On any area of the body: **\$20.00** the first lesion plus **\$10.00** for each subsequent lesion.

With electro fulguration and curetting and thus requiring local anesthesia:

- ▶ On face and neck: **\$80.00** the 1st lesion and **\$60.00** for each subsequent lesion.
- ▶ On any other area of the body: **\$60.00** the 1st lesion and **\$40.00** for each subsequent lesion.

Excision of Skin tags:

- ▶ On the eyelids under LA (Local Anesthesia) **\$100.00** for the 1st one and **\$50.00** for each subsequent one.
- ▶ On the rest of the body WITHOUT LA **\$40.00** for the 1st one and **\$20.00** for each subsequent one.
- ▶ On the rest of the body WITH LA **\$60.00** for the 1st one and **\$30.00** for each subsequent one.

Excision of confirmed benign moles:

ALWAYS UNDER LA

- ▶ On the face and neck. Shaved excision. No sutures. **\$80.00** for the 1st mole and **\$60.00** for each subsequent one.
- ▶ On the face and neck. Block excision with cosmetic repair. **\$120.00** for the 1st mole and **\$100.00** for each subsequent one.
- ▶ On the rest of the body. Shaved excision. No sutures. **\$60.00** for the 1st mole and **\$40.00** for each subsequent one.
- ▶ On the rest of the body. Block excision with cosmetic repair. **\$100.00** for the 1st mole and **\$80.00** for each subsequent one.

Repair of torn earlobe:

ALWAYS UNDER LA.

- ▶ **\$150.00**

Newborn circumcision up to 4 weeks old:

- ▶ **\$175.00**

Any other items not included in this schedule:

The physician to be performing the procedure should first assess the item and then discuss the appropriate fee with the patient requesting the treatment of the said item.
